

**BRING:**

Each Patrol Should Bring:

- ☐ Gauze Pads
- ☐ Cotton Balls
- ☐ Charcoal Pieces
- ☐ Rope: Short and Long Pieces
- ☐ A Tent Ground Cover Or Similar Item
- ☐ Hiking Staffs
- ☐ Patrol First Aid Kit.
- ☐ Flint And Steel

Each Scout Should Bring:

- ☐ Neckerchiefs/bandannas
- ☐ Pocket knife

Scouts should be prepared to use items on them or around them to complete the stations.

At the end of the hike each patrol will be required to prepare a food dish from the food provided by the event staff. Scouts will not know what ingredients they will be using until they are provided.

**STUDY/PRACTICE:**

- ☐ Study identifying and knowing the edible parts and safe preparation of plants including but not limited to: Dandelion, Cattail, Burdock, Plantain, Watercress, Stinging nettle, Mints, Wild carrot/ Queen Anne's Lace, Nut trees and Fruit trees.
- ☐ The scouts should study shelter building in the Wilderness Survival MB book.
- ☐ They will need to study lashings in the Boy Scout Handbook.
- ☐ The scouts should study Basic Wilderness First Aid
- ☐ study alternative fire starting techniques
- ☐ Study the Wilderness Survival MB book: Able to recognize how to signal for overhead help including: Yes, No, Require medical assistance, Require assistance
- ☐ Scouts should know emergency trail signals (groups of 3) and how to use a signaling mirror and other techniques such as using bright colors and odd shapes.

- ✦ Every Troop is expected to help with the judging of the stations. If we do not have enough volunteers then we will not be able to run all of the stations. Each Troop will be assigned a station to man.
- ✦ Some picnic tables may be available on a first come first serve basis for campsites. But be prepared in case one is not available for your Troop.

**VEHICLES IN CAMP**

As in past years we will be asking for your cooperation with keeping the vehicles out of the camping area. Only one vehicle at a time will be allowed in the camp to drop off the troop equipment, they must be parked in the designated parking lot. Please plan ahead by loading all equipment in one or two vehicles. All participating units must carpool.

**CAMPSITES**

Remember that all Boy Scout and Metro Park rules and regulations apply and must be followed. **No vehicles are allowed in the campsite.** Only Troop trailers will be allowed. All vehicles must be parked in the designated parking areas. **No ground fires allowed.** Fires are only allowed in existing fire pits or in an above ground fire pit that you bring.

On Friday night all troops are to meet at Kensington Group Camp. At the group camp the troop trailer can be dropped off and dining areas for Saturday night may be set-up. All scouts and adults not staying at Kensington will then carpool over to Proud Lake Pines Campsite. Only backpacking gear and tent will be allowed at the Pines Campsite. Scouts will leave from the pines on Saturday morning and hike to Kensington. Along the trail there will be 6 wilderness survival stations.
